There is an article mentioned in the November-December Presbyterian Women's Magazine "Horizons" titled "Honoring Tradition." A group of Native American women met prior to the National PW Gathering last summer. These women had an opportunity to connect and discuss some of their "pain, sorrows and even joys about coming together as Christian Native Americans. The article points out the difficulties they have had in not only celebrating and honoring their ancestors but also sharing and expressing the love Jesus has for them and their people. Many times, as I speak to our beloved Navajo Pastor Norma McCabe in Kayenta Arizona, she expresses how difficult it is to minister to some of the women about Jesus's love for them, because of spiritual traditions and they don't speak English. This article addresses many of the issues they face. It is very important to show love to our Native Americans in all ways possible. The women of our church here in FPC, do that every year at Christmas time. We collect products they need which are distributed to the families throughout Northern Arizona Presbyterian churches in the Grand Canyon Presbyter for the holidays and at other times as needed.

As we study our Bible lessons we see how the traditions and practices of our Biblical ancestors influence us in modern times and we learn how it applies to us today. We have the support of other women in our studies to help us in our understanding and support us in God's promise to each of us.


PEACEMAKING AND SOCIAL JUSTICE COMMITTEE

LIBRARY REVIEW

The book Faith-Rooted Organizing by Alexia Salvatierra and Peter Heltzel is a new book that has been added to the library and can be found on the book cart. With so many injustices, small and great, across the world and right at our doorstep, what are people of faith to do?

Since the 1930s, organizing movements for social justice in the U.S. have largely been built on assumptions that are of secular origin—such as



reliance on self-interest and having a common enemy as a motivator for change. But what if Christians were to shape their organizing around the implications of the truth that God is real and Jesus is risen? Alexia Salvatierra has developed a model of social action that is rooted in the values and convictions born of faith.

Together with theologian Peter Heltzel, this model of "faith-rooted organizing" offers a path to meaningful social change that takes seriously the command to love God and to love our neighbor as ourself. (Review by Amazon)

LOU AND RICHARD WIENS HAVE INCLUDED FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN THEIR TRUST.

Richard Wiens is one of the longest time members of our church, with membership dating to the mid 1950s, when A. J. Knolls was pastor. Music was one of the magnets which drew Richard and Lou to First Pres. They were regulars in the Chancel and Praise Choirs, having joined when Lillian Warneke was director. They also sang as part of the civic group Bel Canto Singers, also directed by Warneke.

In his career Richard was a printer at the Telegram Tribune and maintenance technician at the Masonic Lodge. He was especially known for his Bonsai creativity. These days he can be found attending meetings of our church's Wholeness Group.

Lou, who died about a year ago, served as church organist, succeeding Dorothy Wilson. In addition, she succeeded Lillian Warneke as Chancel Choir Director, serving in that role for years. In her career, she taught 2nd and 3rd grades at C. L. Smith School as well as private music lessons.

Lou and Richard have provided for a bequest to our church in their family trust. They are giving back to help preserve the church and church music.
