What does it mean to you to be a Christian?

Lent and Holy Week seem like good times to ask that question. As we spend these weeks reflecting and repenting, then jump into the joy of Easter with both feet...these are the events that shaped the early days of the church, and so it's good for us to ask:

What does it mean to be a Christian?

We asked the members of our youth group that question, and I'm so pleased and encouraged by their responses. One thing you will see clearly: The message of "Love God and love people" is getting through to our kids—isn't that wonderful?

Here are just a few of the responses.

"Being a Christian is living in the light of God and loving everyone the way God loves us."

"Glorify God and love everyone by reflecting God."

"I think being a Christian means believing in God and following in God's steps to strive to be the best person you can, and to just be kind to everyone."

"I think that only half of being a Christian is believing in God and the other half is just being a friendly, kind, and loving person to other people. Making your community a better place by being the bigger person."

I don't know about you, but I find these responses so true and hopeful and challenging. In Matthew 22, a group of religious scholars tried to trip Jesus up by asking him what he thought the most important commandment was. He could have said just about anything, but he gave them two commands, both from the Hebrew Bible, linked together into one. He said:

"Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. 39 And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments."

Love God, and love other people. I know you've heard that somewhere before.

But notice what Jesus says at the end. He does not say that the Law and the prophetic writings of our Old Testament don't matter anymore, he says that all of them—every single bit of them—hangs on the yoked commands to love God and love our neighbors. It's literally right from Jesus' own mouth, the most important thing for us to know and live and wrestle with.

Look back at the responses from our kids. Do you see it? They're getting exactly the message that Jesus wants them to learn—to love God and to show love to the people around us. We've made this a priority teaching here at First Pres, and Jen uses it in every message for the kids. I'll say it again: Isn't that wonderful?

Some of these kids will be coming for church membership on Palm Sunday. They'll stand in front of all of you with some of the grownups who are joining the church and answer the same questions from our Book of Order.

Behind their words, know that they understand what Jesus said about the Greatest Commandment. As you watch them, know that they are maturing and growing into the Christians they will be for the rest of their lives.

What does it mean to you to be a Christian?

Maybe we all ought to reflect on that question during this Lent season.

Maybe we all could use a reminder about who we are and whose we are.

We couldn't do much better than copying the responses of our youngest and newest members.

Peace to you and yours as we move through Lent and into Holy Week. May this season be a challenge and a blessing for you.


