Generous giving is another.



# BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE

Our financial situation as of September indicates a weakening financial health that gives us some concern. In the month of September, total income was \$28,531 and total expenses were \$55,574. This decreased Total Reserves (our savings account) by \$27,043 in one month, giving us a Total Reserves balance of \$61,132 as of September 30.

Total giving this year has averaged \$38,750 a month, compared with the needed \$41,250 to fully fund our program. This \$30,000 shortfall concerns the Budget and Finance Committee. Total expenses as of September 30 are \$2,580 less than expected. However now that we have resumed in-person worship and education programs, we anticipate

expense increases, including staffing increases. Session, particularly committee chairs, will monitor spending in order to assure that critical elements of our mission will be fully funded. Your continued faithful giving will enable FPCSLO to continue and enhance our service to the congregation and the community.

#### PRESBYTERY OF SANTA BARBARA

225th General Assembly 2022 Questions and Answers from Nominees September 18, 2021 Presbytery Meeting

### 1. Please include a short bio introducing yourself.

My name is Jenifer Gordon Rabenaldt. I am the Director of Christian Education/Office Manager at First Presbyterian Church San Luis Obispo. I am fortunate enough to have grown up in this Church and became a member when I was 12 years old. I have served in many capacities. I am an ordained Ruling Elder at First Presbyterian Church San Luis Obispo and have served two terms two different times. I am very proud of my current position as Director of Christian Education/Office Manager and take it very seriously.

Christian Education is a passion of mine and I enjoy sharing that passion with all ages. I am currently in the process of becoming a Certified Christian Educator. I have completed all my course work and the next step is to complete my final project. I pride myself on being a detail person and being able to see the big picture all at the same time. This has proven to be an asset in all that God allows me to do while I serve God's Church here in San Luis Obispo.

I have been involved mostly through education, for all ages. Trying to be a presence that loves and accepts all - even when it's hard. I am blessed to participate with all ages. Nursery through Older Adults. I learn more from them every week than I'm sure they do from me. But, I very much enjoy being the conversation starter, and hopefully knowing enough to answer questions as they come up.

Recently I have been very engaged in finding out how things work and why. Referring to governance locally, regionally and nationally. I believe it's important to have that knowledge and be part of it in order to truthfully share what we, as the PCUSA stand for and hope to accomplish as the Church, Gods Church. And then sharing that knowledge with anyone who will listen.

### MUSIC AT FPCSLO


We are planning to resume rehearsals on Wednesday Nov. 3, with the hopes of beginning to sing an anthem in services throughout Advent.


