

LIBRARY REVIEW

The Israeli-Palestinian Conflict: What Everyone

Needs to Know, by Dov Waxman,

has been added to the library and is available for borrowing. This book is located on the book cart.

This book supplements the reading list of books for the class "How Did We Get Here? Understanding the Israel-Palestine Conflict" that was taught for four



weeks on Thursday evenings via Zoom. Writing in an engaging, jargon-free Q&A format, Dov Waxman provides clear and concise answers to common questions—from the most basic to the most contentious. Covering the conflict from its nineteenth-century origins to the latest developments of the twenty-first century, this book explains the key events, examines the core issues, and presents the competing claims and narratives of both sides. Readers will learn what the Israeli-Palestinian conflict is all about, how it has evolved over time, and why it continues to defy diplomatic efforts at a resolution. (Review Adapted from Amazon)

MISSIONS GET ON THE BUS

"Get on the Bus" brings children and their care givers from throughout California to visit their parents who are in prison. For several years we have been sponsoring a bus that brings girls and boys to San Luis Obispo to spend time with their fathers at CMC. We are now planning for this year's special day, which is Saturday, April 13. For many of these children this is the only time during the year they can see their fathers, all at no cost to the children's families.

As a bus sponsor, we provide volunteers as well as financial assistance, contributing \$2,500 towards the nearly \$6,000 cost of bringing children on one of the buses. We no longer take a special Sunday offering to add to our contribution for "Get on the Bus." However, you have the opportunity to contribute at any time for this worthwhile outreach program by making a donation through the church, noting on the check to FPC that it is for "Get on the Bus."

What is an Estate Planning?
