- A gift annuity may pay one person or two persons jointly with continuing payments to the survivor or to one person for life, then a second person.
- Annuity rates are based on your nearest age on the gift date. The minimum age for immediate payment is 65. For a deferred payment gift annuity,

55 is the minimum age for payments deferred until 65 or later.

- The Presbyterian Foundation welcomes gift annuities of \$10,000 or more.
- Payments will begin after the gift has been made or may be deferred until a future year, such as during retirement.
