Greetings!

I've been thinking a lot about Worship lately. In all of that thinking I thought, why not go back to the basics, and remember why we, as Christians, Worship? What is Worship all about? What should Worship be all about?

The word Worship comes from an Old English root: "worth-ship." That suggests something or someone worthy of honor, glory, and praise. Worship as a noun can mean an act of reverence, a religious practice, or a feeling of respect.

It is more appropriate to think of Worship as a verb. To worship is to love the one who first loved us, from whom all blessings flow, and to be grateful for God's amazing grace. You know, Love God, Love People, Do Things!

As Christians, our Worship is trinitarian. Directed by God, through Jesus Christ, in the Holy Spirit. God is the only one worthy of our worship, Jesus is our model and mediator, and the Holy Spirit shows us God's words and actions and enables us to show our grateful response.

Worship and Service are two sides of the same coin. Our Sunday Worship of God should not contradict our daily service to God. Our Worship on Sunday should be connected to how we live our daily lives. Worship should then mean, to lead a life that honors God and makes a difference in the lives of our neighbors. I'll say it again, Love God, Love People, Do things. As we grow into becoming a Matthew 25 Church, this is important to remember.

I've also been thinking that Christian Worship isn't meant to be easy. It should challenge us and make us uncomfortable. Jesus challenges us to step out of our comfort zones--to not do things the way we've always done things. That gets us nowhere. We should be challenged to not only think outside of the box, but also to get out of that box. We should respect our traditions and at the same time acknowledge the differences of our communities, our country, and our world today.

Worship is meant to be done in community. If something makes us uncomfortable or challenges us, it may just be what someone else needs and is life-giving to them. Worship is intended to be a lifelong practice—changing as we grow and change. Parts of Worship that seem draining to you now may sustain you later. Worship isn't about you, or I. Worship is about serving God and one another in the name of Jesus. Worship isn't about being entertained. The music and liturgy shouldn't be about performing. Rather, the congregation should be in community, praising God for all God has given us, and to glorify God forever in everything we do.

The newest contribution to the Church's endowment was given by two long-time members. Those members have served this church in many ways over four to five decades.

This latest 'Ten thousand dollar" donation for the future of First Presbyterian Church, San Luis Obispo,

was given by Bert and Elaine Townsend. Bert happily exclaimed that it gives him joy to make this gift to the Church, which has been and is a constant part of their lives. Elaine and Bert don't wish to conceal this gift any more than any of us want to put the light of the Good News under a basket. Bert added that part of his regular prayer is *"share our surplus."* Fact is, they hope this legacy gift will be an inspiration to others.

The Townsend family was in this column a few years ago, July 2018, as part of the series about those who are known to have included FPCSLO in their wills. So this current gift is an early sharing of what they plan to bequest eventually. They wish the gift to be added to General Endowments, Unspecified, meaning any allotment will be used at the discretion of Session.

The Townsends are but two of several members who have created a *"gift that keeps on giving"* by including the church in their wills. They have done this as a symbol of the importance of the church in their lives and wish to help the church prosper well into the future by endowing a portion of their current stewardship.

The Townsends have and are serving the church in multiple ways. Elaine has served as an elder and chaired the Missions Committee, was a member of the Peace and Social Justice Committee, and Women of the World. Bert enjoys the fellowship and friends made as a member of Frist Pres and keeping Christ in focus. Work the puzzle to see a dove, a symbol of the Holy Spirit.


The Holy Spirit in the Old Testament

Read each verse, and write the name of the person who received the Holy Spirit.


